SENATE BILLS 380 & 245

Bishop Soto urges Catholics in the Diocese of Sacramento to oppose Senate Bills 380 & 245

The California Senate will be voting on two life-threatening bills in the coming weeks. I urge Catholics to tell their state Senator to oppose these two bills that target the vulnerable lives of children and the frail elderly. During this time of pandemic, we have come to understand how connected we are to one another. We have learned how much children and those with vulnerable health depend on us for care, compassion and companionship. Both bills, originating out of the State Senate violate this covenant of life and love by discarding those who are seen as useless and unnecessary. The Pandemic has made clear that we are all essential in the eyes of God. Senate Bill 245 seeks to remove co-pay cost sharing for all abortion services and would prohibit cost sharing from being imposed on Medical beneficiaries. Let your lawmakers know that women deserve better than abortion and they should instead fund life-affirming services in a patient's health care plan.

Senate Bill 380 would seek to expand access to assisted suicide, eliminate the current safeguards and sunset provisions in the current assisted suicide law.

SEGUNDA LECTURA— 2 COR 5, 14-17

Hermanos: El amor de Cristo nos apremia, al pensar que si uno murió por todos, todos murieron. Cristo murió por todos para que los que viven ya no vivan para sí mismos, sino para aquel que murió y resucitó por ellos. Por eso nosotros ya no juzgamos a nadie con criterios humanos. Si alguna vez hemos juzgado a Cristo con tales criterios, ahora ya no lo hacemos. El que vive según Cristo es una criatura nueva; para él todo lo viejo ha pasado. Ya todo es nuevo.

EVANGELIO— Mc 4, 35-41

Un día, al atardecer, Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: “Vamos a la otra orilla del lago”. Entonces los discípulos despidieron a la gente y condujeron a Jesús en la misma barca en que estaba. Iban además otras barcas. De pronto se desató un fuerte viento y las olas se estrellaban contra la barca y la iban llenando de agua. Jesús dormía en la popa, reclinado sobre un cojín. Lo despertaron y le dijeron: “Maestro, ¿no te importa que nos hundamos?” Él se despertó, reprendió al viento y dijo al mar: “¡Cállate, enmudece!” Entonces el viento cesó y sobrevino una gran calma. Jesús les dijo: “¿Por qué tenían tanto miedo? ¿Aún no tienen fe?” Todos se quedaron espantados y se decían unos a otros: “¿Quién es éste, a quien hasta el viento y el mar obedecen?”



“Porque el amor de Cristo nos apremia, al considerar que, si uno solo murió por todos, entonces todos han muerto” (2 Corintios 5:14).

Cuando llegamos a la convicción de que desde que Uno murió por todos, todos murieron, suceden tres cosas: Ya no vivimos para nosotros sino para Aquel que murió por nosotros (2 Co 5:15).

Ya no conocemos a nadie, incluso a Jesús, “con criterios puramente humanos” (2 Co 5:16).

Somos impulsados por el amor en lugar de estar motivados por mezclas de miedo, orgullo y presión (2 Co 5:14).

Obviamente, alcanzar esta convicción de la muerte de Jesús y de nuestra muerte con Él es uno de los avances más importantes en la vida de una persona. Todo cristiano debería vivir esta comprensión, pero claramente muchos no la viven, o ya no vivirían para ellos mismos.

En este momento, pide al Espíritu Santo que te lleve a la cruz. Por medio de la cruz, el mundo estará crucificado para ti y tu para el mundo (Gál 6:14). El Espíritu confirmará, como solo Él puede, que nosotros, que hemos entregado nuestra vida al Señor, hemos sido crucificados con Él (Rom 6:6) y, por lo tanto, hemos crucificado nuestra carne con sus pasiones y deseos (Gál 5:24). Podemos “alcanzar esta convicción” solo por el Espíritu. Cuando lo hacemos, nos convertimos en cristianos no solo en nombre sino también en actitud, motivación y objetivo. Ya no vivimos para nosotros sino para Jesús.

Oración: *Espíritu Santo, llévame al Calvario y convénceme.*

Promesa: *“Despertándose, Él increpó al viento y dijo al mar: “¡Silencio! ¡Cállate!” El viento se aplacó y sobrevino una gran calma” (Mc 4:39).*

Alabanza: *“Sé fiel hasta la muerte y te dará la corona de la vida” (ver Ap 2:10). Alabado seas, Señor Jesús resucitado. Tu resurrección proporciona esperanza para nuestra futura resurrección.*

SECOND READING— 2 Cor 5:14-17

Brothers and sisters:
The love of Christ impels us,
once we have come to the conviction that one died for all;

He indeed died for all,
so that those who live might no longer live for themselves
but for him who for their sake died and was raised.
Consequently, from now on we regard no one according to the flesh;
even if we once knew Christ according to the flesh,
yet now we know him so no longer.
So whoever is in Christ is a new creation:
the old things have passed away;
behold, new things have come.

GOSPEL— Mk 4:35-41

On that day, as evening drew on, Jesus said to his disciples:
“Let us cross to the other side.”
Leaving the crowd, they took Jesus with them in the boat just as he was.
And other boats were with him.
A violent squall came up and waves were breaking over the boat,
so that it was already filling up.
Jesus was in the stern, asleep on a cushion.
They woke him and said to him,
“Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?”
He woke up,
rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, “Quiet! Be still!”
The wind ceased and there was great calm.
Then he asked them, “Why are you terrified?
Do you not yet have faith?”
They were filled with great awe and said to one another,
“Who then is this whom even wind and sea obey?”

A CONVINCED CHRISTIAN

“The love of Christ impels us who have reached the conviction that since One died for all, all died.” —2 Corinthians 5:14

When we have reached the conviction that since One died for all, all died, three things happen:

We no longer live for ourselves but for Him Who died for us (2 Cor 5:15).

We no longer look on anyone, including Jesus, “in terms of mere human judgment” (2 Cor 5:16).

We are impelled by love rather than motivated by a mixture of fear, pride, and pressure (2 Cor 5:14).

Obviously, reaching this conviction of Jesus’ death and our death with Him is one of the most important breakthroughs in a person’s life. Every Christian should have this realization, but clearly many do not, or we would live no longer for ourselves.

Right now, ask the Holy Spirit to take you to the cross. Through the cross, the world will be crucified to you and you to the world (Gal 6:14). The Spirit will confirm, as only He can, that we who have given our lives to the Lord have been crucified with Him (Rm 6:6) and thereby have crucified our flesh with its passions and desires (Gal 5:24). We can “reach this conviction” only by the Spirit. When we do, we become a Christian not only in name but in attitude, motivation, and goals. We live no longer for self but for Jesus.

Prayer: *Holy Spirit, take me to Calvary and convince me.*

Promise: *Jesus “awoke and rebuked the wind and said to the sea: ‘Quiet! Be still!’ The wind fell off and everything grew calm.” —Mk 4:39*

Praise: *“Remain faithful until death and I will give you the crown of life” (see Rv 2:10). Praise You, risen Lord Jesus. Your Resurrection provides hope for our future resurrection.*
