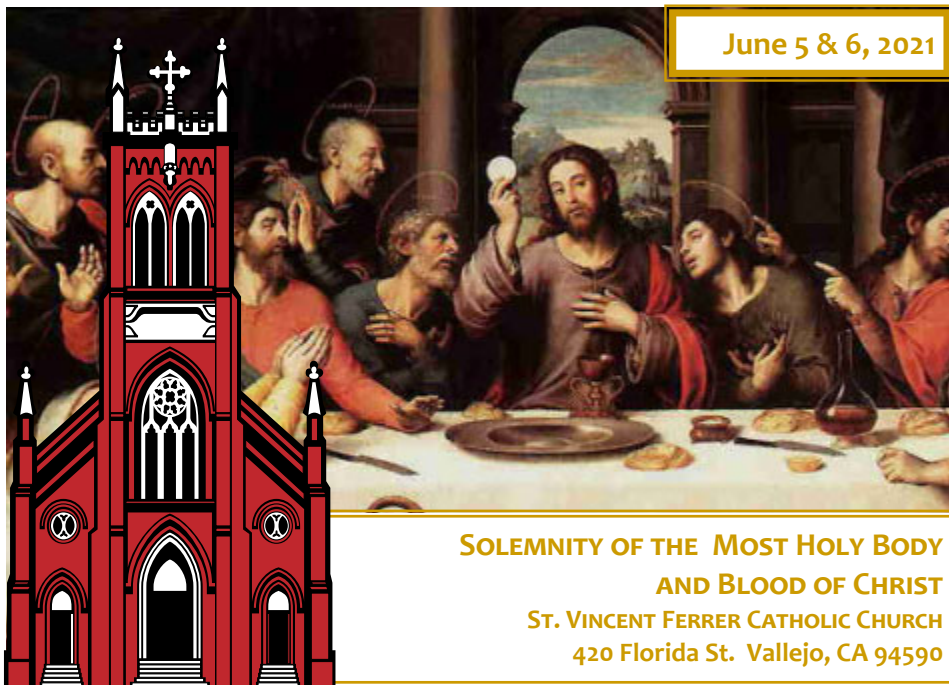

## LECTURAS DE LA MISA DEL DOMINGO

### PRIMERA LECTURA— EX 24, 3-8

En aquellos días, Moisés bajó del monte Sinaí y refirió al pueblo todo lo que el Señor le había dicho y los mandamientos que le había dado. Y el pueblo contestó a una voz: "Haremos todo lo que dice el Señor".

Moisés puso por escrito todas las palabras del Señor. Se levantó temprano, construyó un altar al pie del monte y puso al lado del altar doce piedras conmemorativas, en representación de las doce tribus de Israel.

Después mandó a algunos jóvenes israelitas a ofrecer holocaustos e inmolar novillos, como sacrificios pacíficos en honor del Señor. Tomó la mitad de la sangre, la puso en vasijas y derramó sobre el altar la otra mitad.

Entonces tomó el libro de la alianza y lo leyó al pueblo, y el pueblo respondió:

"Obedeceremos. Haremos todo lo que manda el Señor".

Luego Moisés roció al pueblo con la sangre, diciendo: "Ésta es la sangre de la alianza que el Señor ha hecho con ustedes, conforme a las palabras que han oído".

### SALMO— SALMO 115, 12-13. 15 Y 16BC. 17-18

R. (13) Levantaré el cáliz de la salvación.

### SEGUNDA LECTURA— HEB 9, 11-15

Hermanos: Cuando Cristo se presentó como sumo sacerdote que nos obtiene los bienes definitivos, penetró una sola vez y para siempre en el "lugar santísimo", a través de una tienda, que no estaba hecha por mano de hombres, ni pertenecía a esta creación. No llevó consigo sangre de animales, sino su propia sangre, con la cual nos obtuvo una redención eterna.

Porque si la sangre de los machos cabríos y de los becerros y las cenizas de una ternera, cuando se esparcían sobre los impuros, eran capaces de conferir a los israelitas una pureza legal, meramente exterior, ¡cuánto más la sangre de Cristo purificará nuestra conciencia de todo pecado, a fin de que demos culto al Dios vivo, ya que a impulsos del Espíritu Santo, se ofreció a sí mismo como sacrificio inmaculado a Dios, y así podrá purificar nuestra conciencia de las obras que conducen a la muerte, para servir al Dios vivo!

Por eso, Cristo es el mediador de una alianza nueva. Con su muerte hizo que fueran perdonados los delitos cometidos durante la antigua alianza, para que los llamados por Dios pudieran recibir la herencia eterna que él les había prometido.

### EVANGELIO— Mc 14, 12-16. 22-26

El primer día de la fiesta de los panes Azimos, cuando se sacrificaba el cordero pascual, le preguntaron a Jesús sus discípulos: "¿Dónde quieres que vayamos a prepararte la cena de Pascua?" Él les dijo a dos de ellos: "Vayan a la ciudad. Encontrarán a un hombre que lleva un cántaro de agua; síganlo y díganle al dueño de la casa en donde entre: 'El Maestro manda preguntar: ¿Dónde está la habitación en que voy a comer la Pascua con mis discípulos?' Él les enseñará una sala en el segundo piso, arreglada con divanes. Prepárennos allí la cena". Los discípulos se fueron, llegaron a la ciudad, encontraron lo que Jesús les había dicho y prepararon la cena de Pascua.

Mientras cenaban, Jesús tomó un pan, pronunció la bendición, lo partió y se lo dio a sus discípulos, diciendo: "Tomen: esto es mi cuerpo". Y tomando en sus manos una copa de vino, pronunció la acción de gracias, se la dio, todos bebieron y les dijo: "Ésta es mi sangre, sangre de la alianza, que se derrama por todos. Yo les aseguro que no volveré a beber del fruto de la vid hasta el día en que beba el vino nuevo en el Reino de Dios".

Después de cantar el himno, salieron hacia el monte de los Olivos.

## LA ALIANZA DE SANGRE Y LA COMUNIÓN

*"Esta es Mi Sangre, la Sangre de la Alianza" (Marcos 14:24).*

En la Última Cena, Jesús hizo una alianza con nosotros por medio de Su sangre. En las siguientes veinticuatro horas, Jesús "derramó" Su sangre sobre el Calvario (Mc 14:24). Esto nos recuerda el derrame, incluso el rocío de esa sangre en los sacrificios de animales, sobre el altar en el Templo (ver Lv 17:6). La sangre derramada es una expresión dramática y sensible de compromiso total con el Señor.

El escritor de Hebreos se imagina que la sangre de la alianza no se rocía, sino que se aplica como agente de limpieza. La sangre de Cristo "purificará nuestra conciencia de las obras que llevan a la muerte, para permitirnos tributar culto al Dios viviente" (Heb 9:14). La sangre de la alianza se usa para el arrepentimiento y el perdón de los pecados.

Moisés hizo una alianza de sangre entre el Señor y los israelitas al rociar la sangre de los sacrificios de animales sobre el pueblo. (Imagínese gotas de sangre cayendo sobre sus brazos, en su cara y en su cabello.) Esta sangre salpicada representaba pacto de obediencia, porque, antes de rociar la sangre, el pueblo prometió: "Estamos resueltos a poner en práctica y a obedecer todo lo que el Señor ha dicho" (Éx 24:7, 3).

Cuando recibimos la Sagrada Comunión, nos comprometemos a derramar nuestras vidas en amor total por el Señor, arrepentirnos de nuestros pecados, ser lavados en Su sangre (ver Ap 7:14) y obedecer al Señor en cada detalle de nuestras vidas. Haz alianza de sangre en la Sagrada Comunión hoy en esta fiesta de Corpus Christi.

**Oración:** *Jesús, quisiera recibirte en la Sagrada Comunión todos los días por el resto de mi vida.*

**Promesa:** *"Esto es Mi Cuerpo" (Mc 14:22).*

**Alabanza:** *"La copa de bendición que bendecimos, ¿no es acaso comunión con la Sangre de Cristo?" (1 Co 10:16)*  
*¡Alabado seas, Jesús resucitado!*

## SUNDAY MASS READINGS

### FIRST READING— Ex 24:3-8

When Moses came to the people and related all the words and ordinances of the LORD, they all answered with one voice, "We will do everything that the LORD has told us." Moses then wrote down all the words of the LORD and, rising early the next day, he erected at the foot of the mountain an altar and twelve pillars for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then, having sent certain young men of the Israelites

to offer holocausts and sacrifice young bulls as peace offerings to the LORD, Moses took half of the blood and put it in large bowls; the other half he splashed on the altar. Taking the book of the covenant, he read it aloud to the people, who answered, "All that the LORD has said, we will heed and do." Then he took the blood and sprinkled it on the people, saying, "This is the blood of the covenant that the LORD has made with you in accordance with all these words of his."

### RESPONSORIAL PSALM— 116:12-13, 15-16, 17-18

R. (13) I will take the cup of salvation, and call on the name of the Lord.

### SECOND READING— Heb 9:11-15

Brothers and sisters: When Christ came as high priest of the good things that have come to be, passing through the greater and more perfect tabernacle not made by hands, that is, not belonging to this creation, he entered once for all into the sanctuary, not with the blood of goats and calves but with his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption. For if the blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkling of a heifer's ashes

can sanctify those who are defiled so that their flesh is cleansed, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God. For this reason he is mediator of a new covenant: since a death has taken place for deliverance from transgressions under the first covenant, those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance.

### GOSPEL— Mk 14:12-16, 22-26

On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, Jesus' disciples said to him, "Where do you want us to go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?" He sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the city and a man will meet you, carrying a jar of water. Follow him. Wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, "Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?'" Then he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make the preparations for us there." The disciples then went off, entered the

city, and found it just as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover. While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many. Amen, I say to you, I shall not drink again the fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God." Then, after singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.

## BLOOD-COVENANT AND COMMUNION

***"This is My blood, the blood of the covenant." —Mark 14:24***

At the Last Supper, Jesus made a covenant with us through His blood. Within the next twenty-four hours, Jesus "poured out" His blood on Calvary (Mk 14:24). This reminds us of the pouring out, even splashing, of the blood of the animal sacrifices on the altar in the Temple (see Lv 17:6). Poured-out blood is a dramatic, sensory expression of total commitment to the Lord. The writer of Hebrews pictures the blood of the covenant not being splashed but being applied as a cleansing agent. Christ's blood cleanses "our consciences from dead works to worship the living God" (Heb 9:14). Covenant blood is used for the repentance and forgiveness of sins.

Moses made a blood-covenant between the Lord and the Israelites by sprinkling the blood of the animal sacrifices on the people. (Imagine drops of blood falling on your arms, in your face, and in your hair.) This sprinkled blood represented a covenant of obedience, for, before the sprinkling of the blood, the people promised: "All that the Lord has said, we will heed and do" (Ex 24:7, 3). When we receive Holy Communion, we are covenanting to pour out our lives in total love for the Lord, to repent of our sins, be washed in His blood (see Rv 7:14), and to obey the Lord in every detail of our lives. Make a blood-covenant in Holy Communion today on this feast of Corpus Christi.

***Prayer:*** *Jesus, may I desire to receive You in Holy Communion every day for the rest of my life.*

***Promise:*** *"This is My body." —Mk 14:22*

***Praise:*** *"Is not the cup of blessing we bless a sharing in the blood of Christ?" (1 Cor 10:16) Praise You, risen Jesus!*

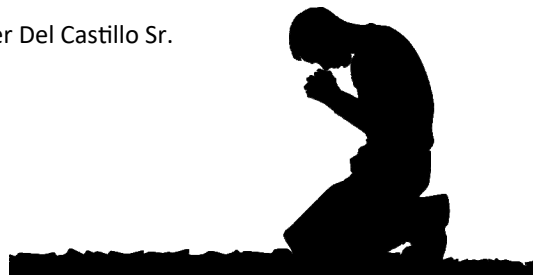
